

KSD PRESIDENTIAL REVITALISATION PROGRAMME.

<u>Purpose</u> : To provide the New Council and Municipal Manager (Mr. Mlamli Zenzile) with updated information and overall progress of the KSD Presidential Revitalisation Programme.

Background.

The Executive Mayor, Cllr. Dumani Zozo, in his capacity as a Member of the Inter-Ministerial Committee for the KSD PI is the local Political Champion of this Programme and the Municipal Manager, Mr. Mlamli Zenzile, is the local Accounting Champion and also a Co-convener of the Provincial Working Group of the KSD PI.

KSD's Vision 2030 Master Plan

In March 2009 the Council of King Sabata Dalindyebo (KSD) Municipality resolved formally to commit to a longterm (20year) Integrated Sustainable Development Plan-commonly known as KSD's Vision 2030 Master Plan. This Master Plan-a product of support by the Department of Local Government and Traditional Affairs- offers a common vision for the future of Mthatha and Mqanduli, and plan to achieve this by 2030. It is the outcome of 9 months of technical investigation and stakeholder engagement, but what is documented in the plan is intended to launch a continuous process of debate and agreements on projects that can lead to improvement and greater sustainability. The structured social facilitation that applied to the crafting of the plan culminated in a Development Charter where all stakeholders agreed to in public- to a social contract.

A Scenario Plan via the social facilitation process's structures and funded by the National Treasury, was also undertaken to establish what will most probably happen in the future. That KSD Vision 2030 Scenario plan was submitted to an International Competition arranged by the US Based Institute For Alternative Futures that recognizes institutions that develop plans aimed at expanding social and economic opportunities for the poor and marginalized, where the KSD PLAN attained fourth position of the first six winners announced by the FUTURISTS JUGDES. Out of a multitude of all the submissions from all over the world, the first six winners were announced in this order,

- 1. PERU
- 2. PAKISTAN
- 3. HAWAII
- 4. SOUTH AFRICA'S KING SABATA DALINDYEBO MUNICIPALITY
- 5. PAKISTAN
- 6. NEW YORK

KSD 's Vision 2030 Master Plan was officially launched by the then Eastern Cape Premier, Hon. Noxolo Kieviet and thereafter it was presented to various Public Sector Institutions – Provincially and Nationally including the Presidency and National Treasury. Presentation of the Master Plan was undertaken during April – June 2009 by a team comprising the Executive Mayor, Municipal Manager and the Programme Manager, Monwabisi Mbana.

Public Announcements

In August 2009, KSD Presidential Revitalisation Programme was then publicly announced by the Hon. Sbu Ndebele, then Minister of Transport, that President Jacob Zuma would make a :"massive intervention" within six months. The Minister went on to say;

"This is not going to happen in the next three years, but within three to six months' time".

"When Zuma spoke about the rapid intervention at KSD, he thought that when one arrives here one arrives at the home of Mandela. But when one enters Mthatha one is welcomed by potholes and bust sewage. This needs to be fixed very soon." (Daily Dispatch News Paper of 2009 Aug 18).

Thereafter the President re-iterated the above (at Ntlaza Stadium during the National Population Registration Campaign) and said:

"We cannot allow Mthatha, the main town in this region to die, because it is dying. We will send a delegation of Ministers under the leadership of the Minister of Performance and Evaluation in the Presidency to come here". He said a decision had been taken about Mthatha and Ministers have been chosen to ensure the revitalisation of the city. At the Cape Town Meeting held on 06 May 2011 chaired by the then Minister of Performance, Monitoring and Evaluation in the Presidency it was resolved to initially intervene in terms of the following Catalytic Projects aligned to KSD Vision 2030 Master Plan :-

- Roads
- Electricity
- Water
- Sanitation
- Human Settlements
- Airport

Indeed within three months, after a lot of logistical / administrative groundwork and interaction between and amongst public sector institutions, National, Provincial and Local-the first formal meeting of the Provincial Working Group focusing on Presidential Revitalisation Programme was held in Mthatha in November 2009 comprising of Provincial HOD's, CEO's of State Owned Enterprises, Workstream Conveners and Management of ORT and KSD Municipalities. Ever since then the Provincial Working Group has consistently convened to focus on KSD PI and over the period has met twenty seven times as detailed in the Institutional Arrangements below under the leadership of the HOD for COGTA-EC, Ms Nombulelo Hackula.

When delivering the State of the Nation Address on the 9th of February 2012, the President stated "the implementation of the Mthatha revitalization project, which is a **Presidential special project**, is proceeding very well. Work is at an advanced stage to improve water, sanitation, electricity, roads, human settlements, airport development and institutional and governance issues"

Further in His 2013 State of the Nation Address His Excellency Jacob Zuma, President of the republic of South Africa, amongst other things, committed to "stabilize the administration and organizational structure at OR Tambo District Municipality and fast-track the implementation of the Presidential Intervention Plans."

In her State of the Eastern Cape Provincial Address, delivered by Premier on the 17th of February 2012.

- "This is clear indication that our efforts in lobbying National government and State Owned Enterprises to invest in our infrastructure development programme are starting to bear fruit. Evidence of this is also demonstrated by the partnership between the Provincial Government and the National Department of Rural Development and Land Reform in the construction of an access bridge over the Mbashe River to Mvezo."
- "As part of the KSD Presidential Revitalization Project, designs for Mthatha logistic infrastructure have been finalised, components of which have already commenced. These include the Airport upgrade, widening of the N2 road between King William's Town and Grahamstown, between Dutywa and Mthatha, as well as between Mount Ayliff and Kokstad.

In his State of The Province Address on 20 February 2015 the Premier of the Eastern Cape, Hon. Phumulo Masualle, amongst other things, stated the following,

- "An amount of R130 million has also been allocated for Section 139 interventions at Makana, Inkwanca and KSD to address institutional capacity, improvement of systems, improvement of audit outcomes, payment of Eskom debt and infrastructure projects.
- In addition, the KSD municipality will continue to be supported through the Presidential KSD revitalisation programme. The cumulative investment in this programme has reached R7billion comprising of R3,7 billion worth of completed projects and R3.5billion currently ongoing projects. The main thrust of the programme is to focus on key catalytic programmes aimed at speeding up socio-economic development in the municipality.
- Forty water and sanitation multi-year contracts, to the tune of R1.5 billion have been awarded and expenditure to date is R650 million. This project will prioritise 999 villages in KSD which previously had no access to water services.

Presidential Visit

Official visits by His Excellency Jacob Zuma, President of the Republic of South Africa to Mthatha, to be apprised of progress and to officiate at the launching and / or official opening of selected catalytic projects of the KSD Revitalization Programme, took place on the 1 September 2011 and 22 November 2013.

Other Visits.

1. Provincial Integrated Urban Development Forum.

On 20 and 21 November 2014 representatives from COGTA- EC, Nelson Mandela Metro, Buffalo City Metro, Office of the Premier (OTP) and KSD, who constitute the Provincial Integrated Urban Development Forum, converged at the Mthatha Stadium to assess progress on Integrated Urban development. The meeting was chaired by a member of the KSD Mayoral Committee, Cllr Nelani. Site visits were undertaken and participants were pleasantly surprised of the work undertaken in this area through the Presidential Intervention.

2. SONA PROJECTS VERIFICATION TEAM.

On 27 March 2015 a high- powered team headed by an Executive Manager from COGTA-National and other Senior representatives form COGTA–EC descended on KSD to assess progress of the KSD Presidential Intervention (KSD PI). They also split into two teams to undertake site visits, after which they prepared a report inclusive of their observations and concerns, to be submitted as required by the then Minister of Co-operative Governance and Traditional Affairs,(Hon. Pravin Gordan) following up on the 2013 State of the Nation Address, which, amongst other things, committed to "stabilize the administration and organizational structure at OR Tambo District Municipality and fast-track the implementation of the Presidential Intervention Plans."

The Executive Manager from COGTA National informed the KSD Programme Manager that he will periodically call for updated reports of the KSD PI Revitalisation Programme as and when he needs such report to update the Minister.

3. VISIT BY THE PORTFOLIO COMMITTEE OF THE OFFICE OF THE PREMIER

On the 29-30 March 2016 the Portfolio Committee of the Office of the Premier visited KSD to be briefed of the Programme progress and undertook site visits. They were pleasantly surprised and commended the amount of work undertaken.

4. VISIT BY HON. JEFF RADEBE, MP, MINISTER IN THE PRESIDENCY.

On 24 June 2016 The Executive Mayor welcomed (**Annexure1**) Honourable Jeff Radebe, MP, Minister in the Presidency for Performance Monitoring and Evaluation who visited our municipality to be updated of Programme progress and undertook site visits. Thereafter the Minister addressed a Community Imbizo at the OR Tambo Hall. He commended progress and the foresight KSD Municipality had in producing its Vision 2030, 3 years before the National Development Plan (NDP). **Annexure 2** is the Briefing Note that was prepared for the Minister by the Content Team comprising of officials from KSD, COGTA –EC and DPME.

INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS.

Aligned to KSD's Vision 2030, operational arrangement of KSD P.I. focused on key catalytic projects of Water, Sanitation, Roads, Electricity, Housing, Airport Development and Institutional-Governance issues. In view of such focus workstreams were established as follows: Transport and Mobility, Human Settlement, Governance & Communication, Water and Sanitation, Social Development and Health, Energy and Environment, LED/Rural Industrialization. Up until the President formally appointed Ministers in May 2011 (**Copy attached**) to constitute the Inter- Ministerial Committee, the Eastern Cape Provincial Government Executive exercised political guidance and oversight to the Presidential Intervention. After the Constitution of the Inter- Ministerial Committee (IMC), the Inter-Ministerial Technical Committee (IMTC) was also established and held its first meeting on 20 June 2011 and consistently thereafter convened to focus on progress of KSD PI as detailed under institutional arrangements below under the able and effective leadership of the Director –General in the Presidency Dr. Cassius Lubisi, under whose authority the Inter-Governmental-Relations Institutional structures have eversince been sustained, hence the acknowledged success of the Presidential Intervention in KSD.

The KSD Inter- Ministerial Committee has so far held five meetings from 2011-2013, one in Cape Town and 4 in Mthatha.
